ORDER DISALLOWING CERTAIN CLAIMS

Upon consideration of the *Receiver's Second Omnibus Objection to Certain Claims* (the “Claim Objection”) ¹ [Dkt. 278], any responses to the Claim Objection, and any reply in support of the Claim Objection, this Court finds that: the relief requested in the Claim Objection is in the best interests of the Receivership Estate, claimants, and all other parties; the Court having further found that notice of the Claim Objection was good and sufficient under the particular circumstances and that no other or further notice need be given; and based upon the record herein and after due deliberation, it is hereby **ORDERED THAT:**

1. The relief requested in the Claim Objection is GRANTED.
2. The claims of On the Edge Ministries and Howard Robbins have been consensually resolved prior to entry of this Order.
3. The claim of Phil Lundquist (Claim No. 41) shall be allowed in the amount of \$56,000 and any additional asserted amounts shall be disallowed.

¹ Capitalized terms not herein defined shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Claim Objection.

4. All of the disallowed or partially disallowed claims as set forth herein, shall be without prejudice to potentially participate in any subsequent distribution plan filed by the Receiver that seeks to distribute Receivership funds on account of Investor's claims to interest as set forth in the Claims Procedures Order.

5. The Receiver is authorized to take all actions necessary to effectuate the relief granted in this Order.

6. The Court shall retain jurisdiction to hear and determine all matters arising from or related to the implementation, interpretation, and/or enforcement of this Order.
